## School Overview

The Dr. Kenneth B. Clark Academy serves students ages 12–21, providing Regents and Career Development, Occupational Studies and Skills Achievement Commencement Credential curriculum access.

Students must be classified with an Emotional Disability, Learning Disability, Speech Impaired or Other Health Impairment to qualify.

Through our partnership with St. Christopher's, Inc., residential opportunities for students requiring this level of service may be considered through the CSE.

Students participate in Regents curriculum, as well as explicit and experiential life and vocational skills experiences in the classroom and in the community.

## School Culture

Through school-wide implementation of a Positive Behavior Intervention Support program, students of the Clark Academy are provided concrete expectations and opportunities to demonstrate safe, secure and positive behaviors throughout the day.

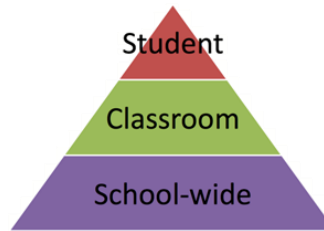
The Clark Academy also ensures students have opportunities to be recognized for their accomplishments through programs such as student of the week/month in various subjects, extracurricular activities such as athletics and fine arts, and school-wide trips and activities.

## Therapeutic Supports

The Clark Academy integrates therapeutic education within the whole school environment including DBT, Peer Mediation and Conflict Resolution.

Students have access to clinicians such as psychologists, occupational therapists and speech and language therapists.

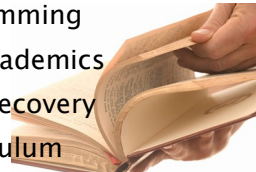
Administrators, school monitors, school aides, and teachers receive Therapeutic Crisis Intervention Training.
